This research is about finding out about the experiences of adults with cerebral palsy when using health services in Ireland.



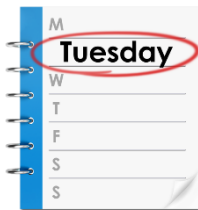
The findings will help make recommendations on how to improve health services for adults with cerebral palsy in Ireland.
